Replaced Scary Window On Front Of Rear Building:





The rocks from the property were organized behind the rear building along the fence.



The Office/Living Room Before The Couple Was Forced Onto The Street & To Leave Everything Behind:




One of the last photos we have of the office space before we were removed. We worked for all the furniture in here.
